<u>Marvellous Maps!</u>	Local Area Walk	<u>Fabulous Fruit</u>
We are learning the names of the five oceans and seven continents of the world. But, what more can you find out about them? Choose a continent or ocean and draw a map or make a fact page about it. Or, you might even like to use your IT skills to create a PowerPoint presentation?	Go on a walk with your family and take a photo of some of the familiar features that you see where you live. Are they human or physical features? It might inspire you to make a simple guide book all about the area that you live in. Or you might like to use your map making skills to draw a map of where you went?	In DT we will be tasting fruit and designing our own fruit salad linked to one of our key texts "Handa's Surprise". Why not try a new exotic fruit or even make your own fruit salad! You could write the recipe for us too! Or perhaps you could survey your family on their favourite fruit? Take a photo and let us know how you got on.
