Next week we are opening our classroom doors from the end of the school day to 4:00pm. Please feel free to drop in with your child, say hello to the class teacher and have a look around. #### Parent Consultation (Yrs 1-6 only)

An opportunity to meet 1:1 with your child's class teacher. 10 minute appointments will be available to book on our website from Monday. Use your eschools log in to do this. We are offering a blended approach to consultations and there are face to face and virtual options available.

If we find there are no requests for virtual meetings we will adjust our plans accordingly. Please be patient with us as we try this new approach. Your children are welcome to attend these meetings if you wish.

If your child is on the Special Educational Needs register you will be offered a longer meeting on a different date with the class teacher and Mr Kendall. Please do not book on the website for this.

#### Volunteering at the school

We are very excited to be able to invite back volunteers into the school. Volunteering can be flexible and is certainly very enjoyable and rewarding. We welcome anyone within the community (parents, grandparents, or people that just wish to help out in the school).

There is a variety of ways in which you can do this. We are looking for volunteers to;

- Read regularly with individual children—reading in the classroom with children 1:1
- Help out in the library scanning in books, keeping the library organised and tidy, helping the children take books out and return them
- Become a Forest School Assistant lighting the fire, cooking toast, making hot chocolate and supporting the children outside Training will be given and you will be supported by staff.

Prior to starting all volunteers must:

- Have a DBS check if you have volunteered previously then please bring your check in for us to see
- Receive safeguarding training **everyone** must attend safeguarding training even if you have volunteered previously. Group training will be provided and the dates available are at the back of this newsletter. Please book a space via the office.
- Receive training and information for the area that you wish to volunteer

You may already have spoken to your child's class teacher or we can find a role/class for you. If your child does not respond well to you being in their class we do reserve the right to ask you to help out elsewhere.

#### **One off volunteering**

If you would like to help but just can not commit to a regular volunteering role you are still able to help out. 'One off' volunteering, for example a school trip or your child's forest school session, is not subject to training and DBS checks. Look out for these opportunities over the coming months.
