We rely on times table facts for our learning in areas such as place value, rounding, multiplication, division, fractions, decimal numbers, percentages, measurement, area, volume, prime numbers, geometry and statistics.
- Try to complete the holiday booklets you'll be given. They're not compulsory just something fun to do if you're looking to fill some time! Inside, you'll find a range of activities, from maths and English to art, science, and even some recipes to try!
- Try something completely new it could be a new sport, food or craft! Mrs O'Mara and I would love to hear about it when you come back to school.
