Geography

- Seasonal weather patterns in UK & hot & cold locations around the world.
- Comparing local area to a non-European country.
- Simple Fieldwork & Observation Skills to study the immediate environment Using basic geographical vocab and refer to local and familiar features.

Maths

Place value

- Count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with zero or 1, or from any given number.
- Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial, representations including the number line and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least.
- Count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals; count in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s.
- Given a number, identify 1 more and 1 less.

Addition and subtraction

- Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs.
- Add and subtract 1-digit and 2-digit numbers to 20, including zero.
- Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20.

Length, height, mass and volume

- Compare, describe and solve practical problems for: lengths and heights; mass/weight; capacity and volume.
- Measure and begin to record the following: lengths and heights; mass/weights; capacity and volume.

Computing

- Understand the presence of technology in daily life.
- Interact with technology busy using a track pad and computer keyboard.
- We will create, save, open and close file.

Science

Animals

Identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals.
