- Activity times Sessions run at 09:15, 11:00, 13:30, 15:15 and 19:00.
- Each session accommodates up to 12 young people and a supervising adult.
- The programme is called 50:50, but the split is flexible and could involve sessions following on directly from an activity, self-led fieldwork, or even be self-leading on one of the nature and adventure trails.



Bedtime

Rooms vary in size and sleep up to 6 people. Boys and girls will be in separate rooms.

Broadstone Lodge Ground Floor

The ground floor plan of Broadstone Lodge includes the following areas and features:

- Entrance:** Indicated by a large upward arrow at the bottom right.
- Main Hall:** A large open area on the right side.
- Kitchen:** Located at the top right, adjacent to the Main Hall.
- Foyer:** A central area connecting the Main Hall, Kitchen, and other rooms.
- Drying Room:** Located in the center, adjacent to the Foyer.
- Corridor:** A central corridor with five numbered green circles (1-5) indicating specific points of interest or measurements.
- Restrooms:** Located at the bottom left, including a **Female** restroom and a **Male** restroom, both equipped with wheelchair accessibility icons.
- Stairs:** A set of stairs is located in the bottom left corner, near the restrooms.
- Room Numbers:** Black circles with white numbers (2, 4) are placed around the perimeter of the main building, likely indicating room numbers or measurements.

They are given a timetable and list of appropriate clothing to wear.





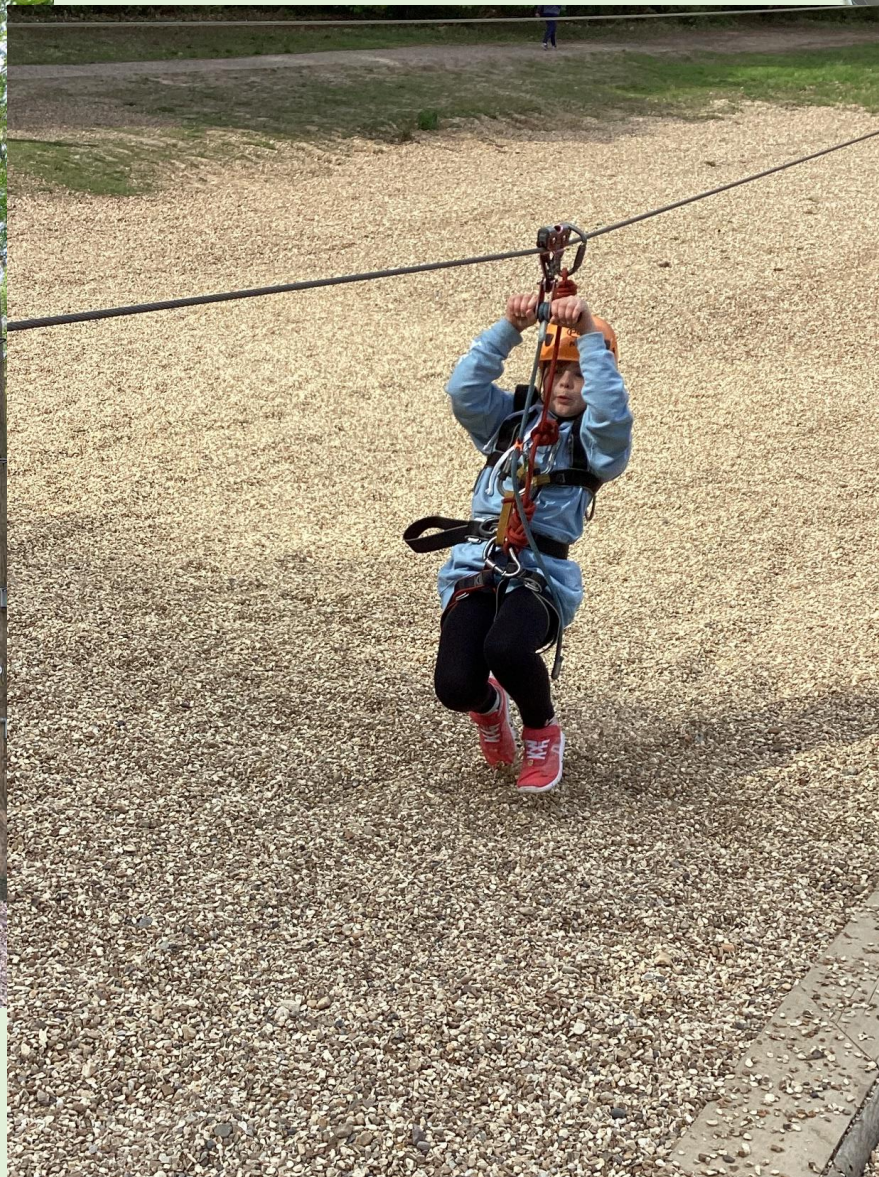
