This week In Oak class:

## Maths

We are going to be using positional language to give and follow instructions to build new models and scenarios. We will look at how an aerial view can be depicted or drawn on a map and have a go at drawing our own maps of the school.

The children will see variety of maps and use these to draw their own.

They will use objects to represent the space they see.



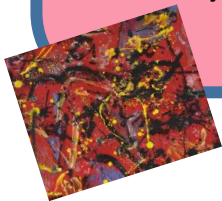
## Expressive Arts and Design

### Personal, Social and Emotional development

Our Growth Mindset character this week is the resilient hedgehog as we remember to keep on trying and not to give up if things are tricky.

Last week we looked at penguins and learnt some key vocabulary. This week we are going to learn all about tigers and where they come from.

We will learn some key vocabulary about tigers and their habitats.



## Understanding of the world

This week we are continuing our learning about maps and the world. We are going to focus on Asia this week and what it would be like to live there. We are then going to learn all about tigers and do some writing about what we find out.

We will be looking at non-fiction books and learning facts about them as well as looking at pictures of them and learning the key vocabulary.



## Literacy and Phonics

Your child is busy learning their set of sounds in their daily phonics group. Please remember we change books every 3-5 days and your child is meant to be able to read the book by the time it goes home as we have been practising in school. They may still need a little bit of help from you, but if not, it does not mean it is too easy, they are showing off all their hard work, working on their fluency and using their story telling voices for you!
