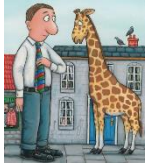




Summer Term Homework Challenges! Once There Were Giants!

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Is there a Giant in that book?</u></p> <p>See if you can find a book about a giant in your local library.</p> <p>Here are some titles you might be able to find. The Smartest Giant in Town (Julia Donaldson) Grandads Secret Giant (David Litchfield) Greta and the Giants (Greta Thunberg) The Heart of a Giant (Hollie Hughes)</p> <p>Read it to an adult or ask them to read it to you. Is it a book we would all like to hear? Maybe take photos, sketch it, and even measure it. Record how much it is growing in cms. Maybe ask an adult to use their phone as a magnifying glass so you can see it up close.</p> <p>It would be lovely if you could send us a picture too!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>All Grown Up!</u></p> <p>In the summer term we will be looking at changes.</p> <p>What has changed about you since you were born? Maybe you could make a photo album to show us some of the important things that have happened in your life and how you have changed. Find out what you were like as a baby. What was your first word?
