To the Rescue! - Make a Splash!



Our topics for the summer term are 'To the Rescue! And 'Make a Splash!' Please complete 2 of these projects each half term so that by the Summer Holidays you will have completed at least 4 of the activities below. These activities are designed to get your creative juices flowing and to be a great opportunity to develop your learning with support from someone at home. I am really looking forward to sharing what you have learned and the new skills you have developed. <p><u>Green Fingers</u></p> <p>We will be finding out all about plants in Science. Have a go at planting some seeds and see what you can grow!</p> <p>We'd love to see a picture of you and your plant! Perhaps you could record what happens to your plant in a diary format, using pictures, photos or sentences?</p>	<p><u>Summer Safari</u></p> <p>Go for a Summer stroll and see what living things you can find.</p> <p>Look out for common wild and garden plants (including trees) and insects, such as bees and butterflies. Keep a record of what you spot. You could make a tally chart, a pictogram or a bar chart to practice your data handling skills too!! Maybe you can spot part of an animals life cycle, such as tadpoles, caterpillars or birds nesting!</p>	<p><u>Time's Up!</u></p> <p>Brush up on your telling the time skills.</p> <p>Can you help your family to tell the time? Have a go at making your own clock and using it to help you to learn to tell the time. Or maybe you might like to draw a timetable of a typical day at your house with times for the things that you usually do, like getting up or going to bed.</p>
<p><u>Build up a Musical Storm</u></p> <p>Get your creative juices flowing by composing and performing your own piece of music! You can use anything you like to make a sound... can you start quietly and get louder and louder like waves crashing, then become quiet again, just like a storm? Or maybe you will be the conductor and your family will be the orchestra? Take a video of yourself performing for the class and share it on Tapestry!</p>	<p><u>Remarkable Rescues!</u></p> <p>In History we are going to be learning about The Great Fire of London, but can you find out about any other real life remarkable rescues? Perhaps you want to learn about the daring deeds of Grace Darling or the heroic life of Florence Nightingale? Maybe it is the terrible tale of the Titanic? Become a History detective and carry out your own research, then report back to us to let us know what you uncovered!</p>	<p><u>Oh, we do like to be beside the seaside!</u></p> <p>We will be learning all about the geography of our coastline and finding out about the human and physical features of the seaside. Take a trip to the seaside yourself and let us know what you find there. You could record your observations with a camera or make drawings.
