


<u>Spring Term Home Learning Projects</u> <u>"A Walk on the Wild Side!"</u>



Please aim to complete <u>two of these projects each half term</u> so by the Easter holidays you will have completed at least 4 of the activities below. These activities are designed to get your creative juices flowing and to be a great opportunity to develop your learning with support from someone at home. Marvellous Maps!	<u>Winter Walk</u>	Fabulous Fruit
Learn the names of the five oceans and the seven continents of the world. Impress us with your knowledge of where they are in the world! You could plan a journey across the globe, visiting each of the continents along the way or make a poster about one of them.	Wrap up warm and go on a walk with your family. Look out for signs that we are in the season 'Winter'. You could take pictures or draw diagrams to show us what you have discovered.	In DT we will be tasting fruit and designing our own fruit salad linked to one of our key texts "Handa's Surprise". Why not try a new exotic fruit or even make your own fruit salad. Take a photo and let us know how you got on.
Animal Facts	Maths	Super Sculpture
Find out about an animal that lives in a hot or cold climate using a book, the internet (with a grown up) or perhaps by visiting a zoo. Why not make a fact page about this animal or present the information in a way that you choose?	Counting on and back to 20. Collect 20 items e.g. pebbles, building bricks, marbles. Practise counting to 20 in 1s, 2s, and 5s. Adding within 20. How many ways can you make 20? You could use objects to show us how to make 20 and write a number sentence E.g. 10+3+7 = 20.	Using any material you like make a sculpture of an animal. If your creation is too large to bring in we'd love to see a photo on Tapestry!

Or get creative and amaze us with some of your own choice topic related learning!
