Communication & Language – Prime Area

## **Expressive Arts and Design – Specific Area**

Role –play – 'Train station'/ 'Ice cream parlour' (acting out real life scenarios or stories)

Make imaginative and complex 'small worlds' with blocks/construction kits

e.g. a city with buildings and parks

Colour mixing

Learn about the artist Pollak- big art canvases outside to be creative with Junk modelling – joining materials and exploring textures

Play instruments with increasing control to express their feelings and ideas. Remember and sing entire songs.
