

# Oak class 16th Mar - 20th Mar

Our half-termly topic is "People Who Help Us," and this week we focus on doctors, nurses and paramedics..

## Communication and Language

We will be exploring the world of paramedics, doctors and nurses. The children will learn about these important roles in society and use new vocabulary to role-play these professions during their playtime.



## PSED



We will continue to focus on kindness and respect, reinforcing our school values. We'll remind the children about making safe choices when selecting games to play. In addition, we celebrate moments of independence in daily routines and play, fostering responsibility and confidence.



## Physical development

Physical development is a prime EYFS area fostering healthy, active lives through gross motor (large movements) and fine motor (precise, small) skills, plus self-care.

Our PE lessons with Mr Green will focus on fundamental gross motor skills. Children will learn to move their bodies in different ways while following instructions through games and using sports equipment like balls.

## UW

Exploring the World of Paramedics and Nurses  
This week we welcome a real nurse to Oak Class! She will share her experiences and explain how she helps people. This is a fantastic opportunity for our children to ask questions and learn important vocabulary related to this profession.

## EAD

This week, we will be inspired by the delightful story 'Zog' by Julia Donaldson, guiding our writing and creative activities.

## Maths

This week, the children will continue practising recalling the composition of numbers as doubles. Towards the end of the week, they will apply their sorting skills to numbers and investigate ways to sort the Numberblocks. Using their previous experience with doubles, they will explore even and odd numbers while building Numberblocks characters, focusing on when a number can be composed of two equal parts.

The children will also investigate 3d shapes and what 2d shapes they can find inside them.



## Literacy

We appreciate your comments in the children's Yellow reading records. Please continue to note how your child is progressing with reading at home. Remember to send their book folders with books and ditty sheets every day. In phonics lessons, we will focus on writing, including letter formation and three-letter CVC words. Children will practice identifying sounds using "Fred fingers" to aid their writing. Additionally, we will work with small groups to write CVC words or short sentences, ensuring proper letter formation to support their developing writing skills.
