

Our school

Loxwood primary school is a one form entry school based in Loxwood, West Sussex. We are part of the Weald locality and both our senior leadership team (SLT) and governor teams are proactive within the localities.

Loxwood is based within a small rural development and has an abundance of outdoor space and woodlands area, which is very much our shining star and school ethos. We have seven classes and work closely with the local Loxwood preschool, located on our site as well. The school has a parent association (PALS) which is active and regularly holds fundraising events, it is a fantastic addition to the school community. We also have a house-based system with 4 houses that represent our community: Brewhurst, Drungewick, Malham & Southlands.



Our school in the community

In 1953 the Nicholsfield housing estate was built in Loxwood and was the first of it's kind in the village. A decade later in 1964, the school was built and the old victorian site on guildford road closed after 200 years. That building still stands today.

Many of the children live and come to school in the village, as you would expect from a rural primary school. In more recent years we have continued to see children from surrounding villages in West Sussex join us, as well as just across the border in nearby Cranleigh, Surrey.

We play an active part in the village, attending local parish meetings, having good relationships with the local public house, the Onslow Arms and are children often visit local sites such as the Wey & Arun canal site.


Ensure financial robustness and stability for 2024 and beyond
